

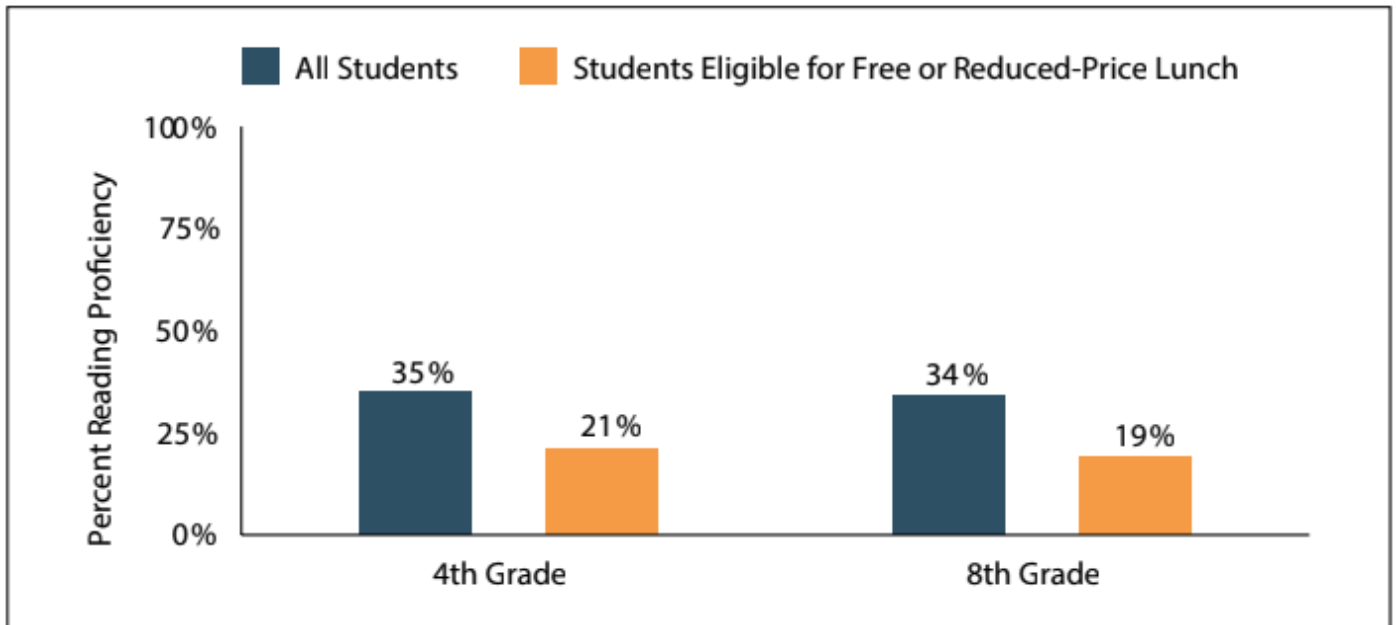

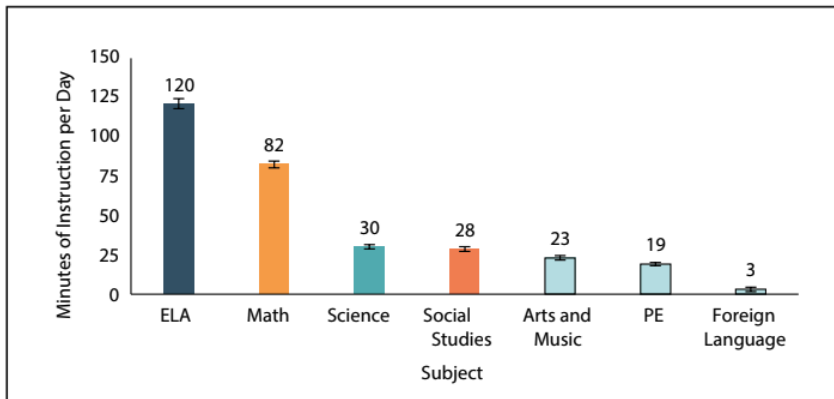

Figure 1: Reading Proficiency

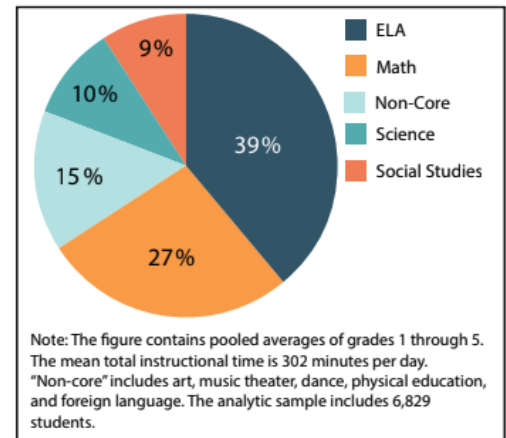

Figures 2 and 3: Time Spent on Social Studies

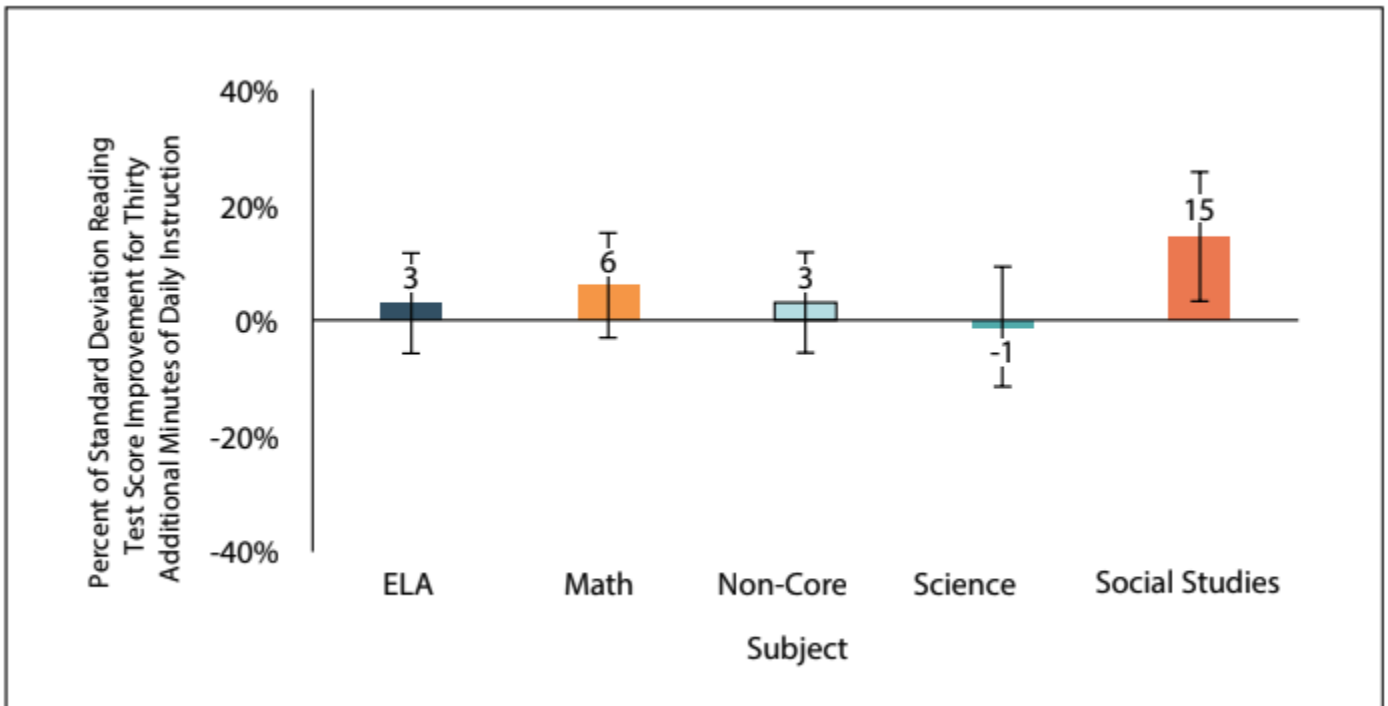
